- Call to Order
 - o Chair Fitch called the meeting to order at 9:00 am
- Roll Call / Attendance
 - Lindsey Dyer conducted attendance:
 - 11/13 voting SERC members present (not present: Shelley Buck, President Robert 'Deuce' Larsen)
 - 3/4 ex officio SERC members present (not present: Sen. Steve Drazkowski)
- Adoption of Agenda
 - Motion to approve the agenda was made by Harralson; seconded by Wittnebel
 - No discussion; agenda was approved
- Updates from Chair/Vice Chair
 - Chair Fitch gave a brief update about flag materials (fabrics, color swatches, etc.)
 that he has received; materials will be brought to the Nov. 21 in-person meeting
- Update on submissions and PR/media
 - MNHS provided an update on number of submissions and media:
 - There were a total of 2,123 flag and 398 seal submissions
 - There were approx. 300,000 page views on the flag and seal websites since they went live
 - Approx. 3,000 public comments have been received, to date
 - There continues to be extensive media coverage locally and nationally
- Discussion: Flag and Seal design submissions
 - Opportunity for Commission members to:
 - Discuss their methodology in selecting top designs
 - Ask questions about the process
 - Discuss overarching design themes (not individual designs)
 - Commission members shared their process for reviewing and narrowing down design submissions. Some process methods included:
 - Multiple reviews of all submissions prior to selecting top designs
 - Leveraging public comments to inform selections
 - Inviting others (via a viewing party) to review selections and gather real-time feedback from individuals with various backgrounds, perspectives, and color/eyesight differences (example: color blind individuals)
 - Asking children about their favorites

- Specialist testimony (9:45am)
 - Dr. Jonathan Good (Seal design testimony)
 - Dr. Good provided testimony on "what makes a good seal design" which included some broad differences between flag design and seal design
 - Flag simple, instant, denotes the state
 - Seal doesn't need to be as simple, it is not a logo or branding; a seal is official
 - Overall, a seal should be round in shape with a ring around the outside for writing (no symbolism in the ring itself)
 - The inside of the seal can include a "scene" or an abstract arrangement of objects:
 - It was encouraged that we avoid including human figures or buildings in the seal; natural elements from the state are welcome
 - Dr. Good shared that recreational icons (like hockey, fishing, etc.)
 are not ideal for a seal
 - The Commission discussed the state motto L'etoile du Nord (translation: "Star of the North") and its language (French).
